10 Principles of Arya Samaj

- 1. God is the primary source of all true knowledge and all that is known by its means.(At the beginning of creation, nearly 2 Billion years ago, God gave the knowledge of 4 Vedas to four learned Rishis named Agni, Vayu, Aditya and Angira. Four Vedas called Rig Ved, Yajur Ved, Sam Ved and Atharva Ved contain all true knowledge, spiritual and scientific, known to the world.)
- 2. God is existent, intelligent and blissful. He is formless, omnipotent, just, merciful, unborn, infinite, invariable (unchangeable), having no beginning, matchless (unparalleled), the support of all, the master of all, omnipresent, omniscient, ever young (imperishable), immortal, fearless, eternal, holy and creator of universe. To him alone worship is due.
- **3.** Vedas are the scripture of all true knowledge. It is paramount duty of all Aryan to read them, teach and recite them to others.
- 4. All human beings should always be ready to accept the truth and give up untruth.
- 5. All our actions should be according to the principles of Dharma i.e. after differentiating right from wrong.
- 6. The primary aim of Arya Samaj is to do good to the human beings of whole world i.e. to its physical, spiritual and social welfare.
- 7. All human beings ought to be treated with love, justice and according to their merits as dictated by Dharma.
- 8. We should all promote knowledge (Vidya) and dispel ignorance (Avidya).

- **10.** In matters which affect the well being of all people an individual should subordinate any personal rights that are in conflict with the wishes of the majority. In matters that affect him/her alone he/she is free to exercise his/her human rights.

Paavakaa = purifier Nah = to us Sarasvati = the knowledge of the Veda Vaajebhir = wealth of knowledge and prosperity Vaajinvati = associates us with pure and righteous deeds Yajnam = welfare of others Vashtum = accomplishment

Dhiyaa – vasuh = through knowledge and actions.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2018 – 2019 FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES PRESENTED BY MRS. BRIJ BALA DUGGAL FOR THE AGM ON 28TH JULY 2019 HELD AT ARYA SAMAJ (VEDIC MISSION) WEST MIDLANDS.

Following the last AGM (29th July 2018) and after gaining the vote of members, Dr. Narendra Kumar applied for an extension of another two year term to remain 'Chairman' of the Board of Trustees of Arya Samaj (Vedic Mission) West Midlands and has continued to take full responsibility for following up the unfinished work at the building. This has involved dealing with all issues directly and indirectly with Project Manager, Builders and HS2 Representatives as well as managing 'day to day' affairs of ASWM and organising events etc. As contemplated, at the last AGM, the building work has continued and there are still some external repairs as well as basement work to be carried out.

The Appeal made to our members early last year, for raising funds for work not covered by HS2, has enabled us to raise over £60,000 so far and continues to rise. The Board of Trustees take this opportunity to acknowledge members generous support and at the same time thank them all for the same.

Women's Help Centre

After four difficult meetings, held between period of September 2017 till June 2018, and our futile attempts to reach agreement on issues of Lease/rent, with our tenant, we had to issue a Notice to WHC either to pay proper rent or vacate the premises. WHC decided to vacate the premises and asked for compensation of £7000. ASWM offered to pay £4000 through our solicitors. This amount was paid and they moved out on 29th March 2019. This part of the building stands empty and requires complete refurbishment. We have made a planning application for 'Change of Use' so that we can turn it into

offices on first floor and a retail shop on ground floor which will enable us to earn a regular income for ASWM.

A Memorable Year

Last year, on the whole, was a mixture of sorrows and joys. Joys in terms of our achievements and all the happy occasions, members have celebrated at ASWM i.e. birthdays, anniversaries, festivals and of course a fantastic Charity Dinner Evening with entertainment from famous Ghazal Singers. Sorrows relate to our loss of so many devoted members.

Sponsored Yajman

Total sponsored Yajmans for Sunday Havans in the year 2018 (Jan-Dec) were 18. This is less than 2/3 of last year's figure. However, since April this year there has been some improvement in Sunday Havan bookings by new members.

Sanskar Performed by Acharya Ji

Acharya Ji performed 47 sanskars in the last year (April 2018 – March 2019). Total income from these was £3818.

During the period from July 2018 to June 2019 more than twelve functions and events were organised by ASWM. I give below brief details of some of these:

- Lectures by Dr. Naveen Kumar Arya These took place at the Bhavan from 8th of August to 12th of August 2018.
- Ved Katha 26th August to 2nd September 2018 Ved Katha sessions took place between 6:30 and 7:30 pm. throughout the week. Acharya Yadav Ji shed light on Kenopanishad Katha.
- Gaytri Maha Yajna 9th September 2018 Annual Maha Yajna was held on 9th September 2018 and this was the first one at our new Bhavan. More than 150 people participated in Page 7

this event. The whole event was recorded by Aastha Television Channel team and subsequently televised.

- Diwali Celebration 10th November 2018 This event was attended by 150 people. The evening began with Havan at 6:00 pm followed by refreshments and Diwali sweets being served at 6:30 pm. The day's programme included songs, dances and ghazals and Rishi Langar was provided by Arya Samaj.
- Charity Dinner and Entertainment Evening 1st December 2018 - This event which we called 'Ghazal Ki Shaam' was a tremendous success and helped raise funds by £3,000 after deducting expenses. Throughout the evening, we were entertained by Mr. Qamar Ali, Meena Kumari and Mr. Saber Massi (famous ghazal singers and Tabla players). The programme started at 6:00 pm and went on till after 11 pm with breaks for refreshments and dinner.
- Republic Day Celebration 27th January 2019 We celebrated 70th Republic Day of India in the presence of more than 80 members.

In addition to the above mentioned events ASWM also celebrated

Raksha Bandan on 26th August 2018, Krishan Janamashtmi on 2nd September 2018, Basant Panchami on 10th February 2019, Holi Festival on 24th March 2019, Rishi Bodh Utsav, and Arya Samaj 144th Foundation Day on 7th April 2019.

Historical Day for Arya Samaj - 26th June 2019

We are now on the list of Religious places to be visited by students/pupils from Schools in Birmingham and first of these visits

took place on 26th June 2019. We were visited by 170 pupils (aged 12-13 yrs) from year 8 of Great Barr Academy. They came in two separate groups each accompanied by 5 teachers. They were shown around the building then given a brief introduction to Arya Samaj, our beliefs and principles and activities.

Parents and Toddler Group

This was a six month project funded by 'Ageing Better' that began on 6th June 2018 and ended in November 2018. Allocated funding was not fully utilized. A part-time cook was employed on Wednesdays during this period.

Matrimonial Services

Our Matrimonial services are not being used as much as they have been in the past. Although we have new registrations, previous members are often not renewing and of course some of them are now married. Despite our efforts to improve services, update technology and organise another matrimonial day, bookings were too low and imbalanced for us to proceed with the organised matrimonial day.

Activities

Our Day Centre and Yoga group continue to take place on Wednesday mornings between 11:00am and 1:00 pm. Lunch is available after 1:00 p.m.

Another Yoga group was started in May 2019 and this takes place on Thursday evenings between 7.00pm and 8 .15p.m. Dr. Dheeraj Joshi from the CGI office (a well acclaimed Yoga Teacher) teaches Yog Pranayam (Level 1). All are welcome and is total free.

Our Congregation continues to meet on Sundays to perform Havan, listen to Acharya Ji's parvachan and share news and information. Rishi Langar is provided at 1:00 pm.

On the first Sunday of each Month between 7:00 am and 8:00 am Acharya ji gives Vedic sermons on Radio XL Birmingham as well as information and news about forthcoming events at ASWM.

We are working on setting up Indian Classical Dance Classes in the near future.

In concluding my report for the year, I would like to add that despite all the outstanding building repairs and new repair problems arising, members of the Board of Trustees have worked really hard and shown great commitment to promote the work of Arya Samaj. We have continued to organise events and provide much needed services to our community. Despite pressures and distractions we remain focussed.

You will all be pleased to know that Mr. Joginder Pal Sethi and Mr. Vijay Kumar have now been appointed as member of our Board of Trustees. Other changes are that two members of the Board of Trustees have left during this period.

Board of Trustees would like to thank Acharya Yadav Ji for his vital role in ASWM and would also like to thank Raji Chauhan our Office Manager for her role and her work often under pressure of tight deadlines.

A special thanks from us also goes to Mr. Harish Malhotra Ji for his devotional duty towards ASWM at all events.

Lastly, but most importantly, on behalf of the Board of Trustees, I would like to thank all our members for their continued support and commitment to ASWM. As I have said in my previous reports, it is with your support that we continue to carry on the valuable work started by our Founder Maharishi Dayanand Saraswati.

The Hawks and Their Friends

This is another interesting story from the album of Jataka Tales.
